Our **"Pawns of Justice Team"** performed brilliantly and are looking forward to many more tournaments to come, watch this space.....!!

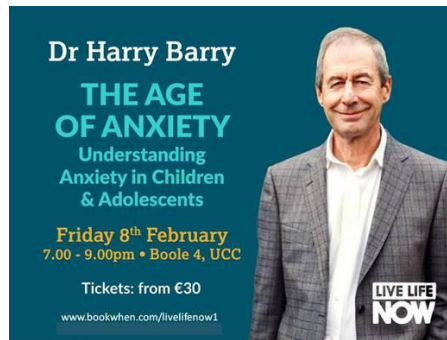


Grand Parents Day

Tracy is Bank of Ireland Innovation Community Manager - West Region for the last three and half years.

She is also Global Faciliator at Startup Weekend for the past few years. "Startup Weekend" events are 54-hour events designed to provide superior entrepreneurship education for people with diverse skills. Beginning with Friday night pitches and continuing through brainstorming, the event culminates in Sunday night presentations.

As facilitator, Tracy has flown to destinations across Europe getting a deep dive into their ecosystem over 54 hours while building relationships as she went. Previous locations included Oostende, Prague, Malta, Budapest, Brussels, Koblenz, and Luxembourg.

Tracy is also a daily sea swimmer all year round. She likes to hike, run, cycle and lift weights. She can play the fiddle after taking it up last year and is currently learning how to make all sorts of wonderful(ly useless) connected devices!

She has a fundamental belief in the power of true community. Tracy is just on the learning curve of understanding how towns and cities as physical representation of their communities can thrive.
